SOFTBALL MANITOBA



Incorporated May 18th, 1965, the Manitoba Softball Association, now known as Softball Manitoba, is the recognized Sport Governing Body for Fast Pitch (includes orthodox) and Slo-Pitch Softball within the Province of Manitoba, and is a member of Softball Canada, the National Sport Governing Body for the sport of Softball. The mission of the Association is to promote and develop softball at all levels, by providing leadership, programs and services to meet the needs of all participants, thus enhancing the profile of softball in Manitoba.

Softball Manitoba is a non-government, non-profit organization housed at 321-145 Pacific Avenue located in Winnipeg. The Association's Board consists of men and women who volunteer their time and skills in the interest of softball. Twelve elected Directors represent the interests of Minors, Fast Pitch, Slo-Pitch and Officials Divisions within the Association. Four members of the Advisory Board are also elected to provide guidance and support to the Association's programs. Softball Manitoba staff administer the policies and programs of the Association. The programs of Softball Manitoba are financed through membership fees, Sport Manitoba and private sector sponsorship.

Softball Manitoba Membership is open to softball leagues and organizations as approved by our Board of Directors. All registered players, coaches, managers, officials, league administers and volunteers are participants of Softball Manitoba whether they be voting or non-voting members of the Association. This membership is for the current year only (from April 1st to March 31st of the following year).

TIMBITS SOFTBALL



The Timbits Softball Program is a revolutionary way of introducing the sport of Softball to children. It is made up of three (3) age appropriate levels (5 – 10 yrs. old), and activities are included which foster the involvement of all players, including players with high and low skill levels. The child will experience excitement, enjoyment and success. Activities and lead-up games are patterned after informal playground games that promise an hour of fun and lots of action. Each level takes into account the characteristics of children (both mentally and physically) to ensure that each child has fun, experiences success and is gradually introduced to a competitive environment. PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Softball Manitoba's Development Committee offers clinics and programs in all areas including Throwing, Catching, Hitting and General Skills. Clinics are offered in various levels from the grassroots player to the elite athlete.

CANPITCH



Canpitch is Softball Canada's national pitching program which introduces and develops the skill of windmill pitching to children and youth. Throughout the program pitchers will learn and develop the fundamental skills of pitching, see their progress as they move from one stage of pitching development to the next following a clearly defined pathway, be introduced to the concepts of fair play, fitness, safety, teamwork, and the importance of a positive attitude, have a fun, memorable experience.

COACH DEVELOPMENT



A key to the success of any sport, from recreation to the elite level, is the development and implementation of a superior coaching program. Coaching clinics are offered for all levels beginning with Timbits Coaching for the novice coach to the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP).

OFFICIALS DEVELOPMENT

With the objective of upgrading and standardizing the skills and knowledge of the game for umpires, Softball Manitoba offers programs for the novice umpire (Watch the Ball) to the National Officials Certification Program (NOCP levels I-V). Upon completion of the certification program, officials are qualified to umpire at the League, Provincial, National/Regional and International Levels. Leagues are encouraged to visit our website for information regarding the 2018 Officials' clinic schedule and other Program information. Softball Manitoba maintains a list of all registered umpires, which is available to leagues that are registered with the Association.

ACCIDENT AND LIABILITY INSURANCE

Once your league is a member of Softball Manitoba, all participants of your organization are insured through the Liability and Accident Program offered through All Sport Insurance (all participants of your league must be registered).

Who is covered? All participants collectively including executives, managers, coaches, trainers, officials and volunteers while acting within the scope of their duties.

The general liability coverage is \$5,000,000.00, which pays for your defense as well as any costs found against you.

The sports injury insurance provides coverage for practices, games, and team travel (within Canada). For each separate accident the plan pays:

• Blanket Accident Reimbursement - up to \$25,000.00 (prescription drugs, ambulance, hospital services). Effective April 1, 2016, the rates within the Sport Accident Policy for all therapy will be changed to \$50.00 per visit with a maximum of \$2,000.00 per accident over a 52 week period from date of the

accident. This includes physiotherapy, athletic therapy, chiropractor, massage therapy and osteopath;

- Accidental Death \$25,000.00;
- **Dental** up to \$10,000.00 for dental treatment resulting from injury to sound natural teeth;
- Rehabilitation Indemnity Benefit (up to \$5,000);
- Tuition Fees Reimbursement (up to \$5,000);
- Fracture Indemnity Benefit (up to \$500):
- Eyeglasses and Contact Lenses Expense (up to \$200.00 for repair or replacement).

- FOCS Part 1 and 2 + MED Online Evaluation = 2021 substitute for Competition Introduction
- Coaches who are Competition-Introduction Trained (with MED Evaluation) or Competition-Introduction Certified meet 2021 eligibility requirements. All other coaches require components stated above.
- All registered Minor Division softball coaches are required to complete the 3-hour online training "Respect in Sport Program". See Below. Coaches who certified prior to 2016 must re-certify in 2021 (RIS certification renewal requirements every 5 years).

RESPECT IN SPORT PROGRAM MINOR CATEGORY COACHES

Sport Manitoba launched the Respect in Sport Program on November 30, 2006. Respect in Sport is an online training course being implemented for all coaches in Manitoba. Sport Manitoba is initiating this program to create a better sport environment for children through education. All registered Minor Division softball coaches are required to complete the 3-hour online training here, https://sportmanitoba.respectgroupinc.com/

Sport Manitoba's Sport for Life Resource Centre has been developed to encourage efficient use of community resources and to promote cooperation and sharing among the sport community. The Resource Centre brings together a variety of partners within the sport community, maximizing the number and types of resource available to the community. The sport community will have access to the equipment and resources necessary to further their growth and development as athletes, coaches, officials and community leaders.

The Sport for Life Resource Centre includes a library for most sports, including Softball, along with a computer lab available for public use and the delivery of sport education programs.

QUALICO TRAINING CENTRE

In 2010, Sport Manitoba took a major step forward by developing a new home base in the Sport for Life Centre. A first in Canada, the new Sport for Life Centre at 145 Pacific Avenue is a one-stop resource for creating a healthier community by helping athletes and youth learn, grow and succeed in sport.

Phase two construction included: a training track and sprint lanes, strength, conditioning and testing areas, aerobic training center, and a multi-purpose area which can be used as court spaces and for fitness training and workshops.

The sport expertise, fitness, training, and coaching housed in Phase I has been put to use in the fieldhouse to provide programming for local schools, community groups, amateur sport teams, and elite athletes.
